Election to decide Hedley CISD tax

Hedley school officials are hoping voters will approve a higher tax rate this November to help the district compete on faculty and staff salaries and keep up with maintenance and safety issues.

The Voter-Approved Tax Ratification Election (VATRE) will be held Tuesday, November 5, which is the same day as the presidential election. Early voting will be from October 21 to November 1.

Voters are being asked to approve a 12-cent increase in the school district's ad valorem rate, which would bring it to \$0.7892 per \$100 valuation, and would bring in an additional \$257,394 to the district.

"We don't have the money to compete with other districts, and we'd like to give just a little more for salaries and stipends," Superintendent Tracey Bell said. "We'd also like to put some back for maintenance and operations."

October 16, 2024

City consults lawyer on trash service

Garbage was high on the agenda of the Clarendon City Council when it met in regular session last Thursday.

With some residents continuing to report Dumpsters not being picked up, the council met in closed session with the city attorney for about 25 minutes to review the city's franchise agreement with Waste Connections for the collection, hauling, and disposal of solid waste.

After the council returned to open session, aldermen approved a motion to retain the Underwood Law Firm and direct them to send a demand letter to Waste Connections.

October 25, 2024

Waste Connections responds to council

Clarendon officials this week continue to work with Waste Connections to resolve issues with garbage collection in the city.

The city council responded to citizens' complaints about trash not being picked up by meeting with its attorney on October 10 and then authorizing an attorney to write a demand letter to Waste Connections.

City Administrator Brian Barboza said Monday the sanitation company contacted him after they read the Enterprise's online coverage of that meeting.

"I'm not sure the letter had even been sent yet," Barboza said.

Waste Connections Amarillo District Manager Bobby Fira sent a letter to Barboza referencing the ClarendonLive.com article and stating that the company strives to maintain good service.

"We do acknowledge there have been some service issues over the last two months, and we want to apologize," Fira says in the letter obtained by the Enterprise. "There have been some extenuating circumstances though. Our long-standing

Clarendon driver retired from WCN on 8/16/2024 which required us to employ a new driver in the city. We have also experienced some truck issues with a very old truck that was primarily being used in Clarendon. We have worked vigorously to resolve these issues."

Voters narrowly rejected the proposal with 108 FOR the measure to 135 AGAINST it.

City Council grills trash service rep

Garbage collection was high on the agenda of the Clarendon City Council during its regular meeting last Thursday, December 12, as aldermen again grilled Waste Connections about its performance in the city.

Things seemed to be improving when the council met in November; but after tapering off, the number of missed Dumpster complaints has started going up again, city officials said.

Waste Connections representative Christian Rios told the council the company has had "some hiccups the last couple of weeks" and said Waste Connections was willing to refund \$3,000 to the city for its missed collections. The company claims a 95 percent collection rate.

"That's an insult," Alderman Eulaine McIntosh said. Alderman Ashlee Estlack agreed and pushed back against the company's collections claim.

"There's no way we're at 95 or more percent collections," Estlack said.

Alderman Tommy Hill said his trash had not been picked up in three and a half weeks and suggested a Waste Connections supervisor come ride with the local driver for a week to see what's happening.

City Administrator Brian Barboza brought up needing Waste Connections to allow the city to go out early for proposals for trash service. "We're not going to renew," Barboza said. To which Rios responded, "We're not going to rebid."
